Apocynaceae


Plant Specifics

- Size: 2 to 3.5 ft tall by 1.5 to 2 ft wide
- Life Span: Short-lived perennial
- Flower Color: Pink
- Phenology: Winter dormant. Blooms spring-summer.
- Habitats: Open seepage areas, marshes, marshy areas along streams.

Landscaping

- Recommended Uses: Plant in moist to wet areas where it can be grown in large clumps.
- Light: ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade
- Moisture Tolerance: Stays Wet ----- to ----- Usually moist, occasional inundation
- Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
- Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
- Soil/Substrate: Clay, Loam, Sand
