Plant Specifics

Size: To 10 ft tall by To 10 ft wide

Life Span: Long-lived perennial


Flower Color: Yellow

Fruit Color: White

Phenology: Evergreen. Blooms and fruits year round.

Habitats: Coastal hammocks, pine rocklands, coastal flats, disturbed forest edges.

Recommended Uses: Background plant somewhere between a shrub and vine in character.

Light: ☀️ Part Shade

Moisture Tolerance: Somewhat moist, no flooding ----- to -----
Somewhat long very dry periods

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: Moderate. Tolerant of salty wind and may get some salt spray. Exposure to salt spray would be uncommon (major storms).

Soil/Substrate: Loam, Lime rock, Sand
