Asteraceae (Compositae)

Plant Specifics

- Size: 2-4 ft tall by 1 ft wide
- Life Span: Short-lived perennial
- Flower Color: Yellow
- Fruit Color: Brown, NA
- Phenology: Winter dormant. Blooms fall and winter.
- Habitats: Wet prairie, herbaceous seepage areas, wet roadsides.

Landscaping

Recommended Uses: Useful as a colorful wildflower along the edge of a wetland. Often overlooked as sunflowers are blooming at the same time. But if the site is appropriate, worthwhile.

Light: ☀ Full Sun

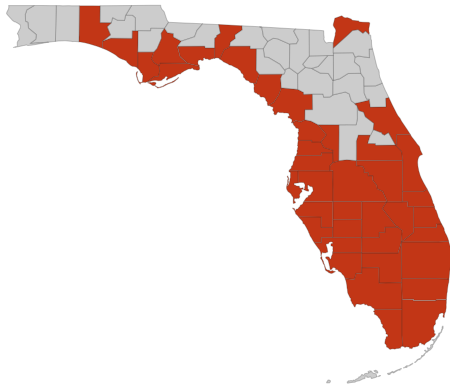
Moisture Tolerance: Stays Wet ----- to ----- Usually moist, occasional inundation

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray

Soil/Substrate: Organic material (muck), Sand
