Size:	10-30 ft tall by 10-20 ft wide
Life Span:	Long-lived perennial
Flower Color:	White
Fruit Color:	Blue
Phenology:	Deciduous. Blooms in spring. Fruits summer-ear fall. Likely lives 50 yrs. or less.
Habitats:	Riverine swamps, bluffs, bluffs, gum swamps. Typically in areas of relatively brief, shallow inundation.

Recommended Uses:	Use along streams or edges of retention area Can be a screen or specimen tree in moist areas. Blooms better in moderate to high ligh settings.
Light:	🏟 Full Sun, 🜤 Part Shade, 🌰 Shade
Moisture Tolerance:	Stays Wet to Not wet but not extrem dry
Salt Water Flooding Tolerance:	Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
Salt Spray Tolerance:	Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray

### Wildlife



Birds and small mammals consume the fruit.

Attracts long-tongued bees, short-tongued bees, wasps, and butterflies.

Larval host for cecropia silkmoth (*Hyalophora cecropia*) a spring azure butterfly (*Celastrina ladon*).
