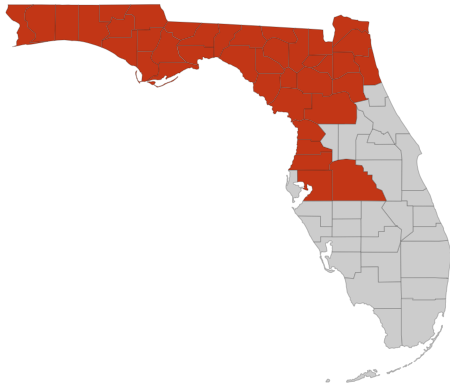
Parsley Hawthorn

Rosaceae

Plant Specifics

Size:	25 ft
Life Span:	Long-lived perennial
Flower Color:	White
Fruit Color:	Red
Phenology:	Deciduous. Blooms in spring. Fruit ripe by fall or may persist into winter.
Habitats:	Moist sites. Riverine forests, moist wooded slope such as ravines and bluffs, stream banks.

Landscaping

Recommended Uses:	Specimen plant for floodplain or moist setting:
Light:	☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade, ☷ Shade
Moisture Tolerance:	Stays Wet ----- to ----- Somewhat moist, no flooding
Salt Water Flooding Tolerance:	Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
Salt Spray Tolerance:	Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
Soil/Substrate:	Loam, Sand

Wildlife



Birds and other wildlife consume the fruit, but not as popular as other haws.

Attracts pollinators, especially important for native bees.

Larval food for hummingbird clearwing moth (*Hemaris thysbe*), striped hairstreak butterfly (*Satyrium liparops*), and blindfold sphinx moth (*Paonias excaecata*).
