Joe-pye-weed, Queen-of-the meadow

Asteraceae (Compositae)

Also known as *Eupatorium fistulosum*

Plant Specifics

Size: 4-6 ft tall by 2-2.5 ft wide

Life Span: Long-lived perennial


Flower Color: Purple, lavender

Fruit Color: Black, NA

Phenology: Winter dormant. Blooms late summer.

Habitats: Moist hammocks, flatwoods, stream banks.

Recommended Uses: Mass planting or specimen plant in moist areas. Best for informal gardens.

Light: ☀ Full Sun

Moisture Tolerance: Usually moist, occasional inundation ----- to Not wet but not extremely dry

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: Some tolerance to salty wind but not direct spray.

Soil/Substrate: Loam, Lime rock, Sand
