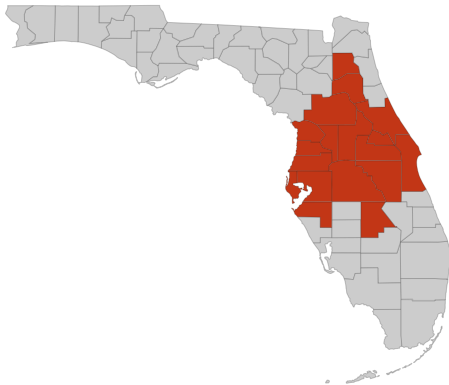

Asteraceae (Compositae)

Plant Specifics

- Size: 5 ft tall by 5 ft wide
- Life Span: Long-lived perennial
- Flower Color: Lavender
- Phenology: Evergreen. Blooms late fall. Can live 25-50 years (Nelson 2003)
- Habitats: Sandhill, open areas in xeric hammock, scrub, scrubby-sandhill, scrubby flatwoods.

Landscaping

- Recommended Uses: Specimen or hedge plant.
- Light: ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade
- Moisture Tolerance: Somewhat long very dry periods ----- to -----
Very long very dry periods
- Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
- Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
- Soil/Substrate: -

Attracts butterflies and moths, bees, and other insects.
Documented bees include *Colletes mandibularis*,
Agaposternon splendens, *Augochlora pzcra*,
Augochlorella aurata, *Augochloropsis rnetallica*,
Dialictus ~niniatulus, *D. nymphalis*, *D. placidensis*,
Anthidiellum notaturn rufimaculatum, *Coelioxys*
mexicarza, *C. sayi*, *Megachile merzdica*, *M. pruina*, *M.*
xylocopoides, *Epeolus carolizus*, *Bolnbzcs impatiens*
and *Xylocopa virginica krombeini* (Deyrup et al. 2002)
