Verbenaceae

Also known as *Verbena maritima*

Plant Specifics

Size: 1 ft tall by 1-1.5 ft wide

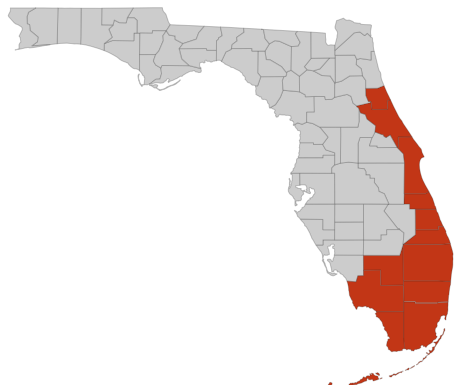
Life Span: Long-lived perennial

Flower Color: Purple

Phenology: Evergreen

Habitats: Back dunes, dunal swales, coastal hammocks. Sandy open areas.

Recommended Uses: Wildflower garden, groundcover. Would also work well as a mass planting. Can be grown containers.

Light: ☀ Full Sun

Moisture Tolerance: Not wet but not extremely dry ----- to ----- Ver long very dry periods

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: High. Can tolerate significant and ongoing amounts of salty wind and salt spray without injury.

Soil/Substrate: Clay, Loam, Sand

Nectar source for a variety of butterflies and moths, including Gulf fritillaries, hawkmoths and long-tailed skippers.

Pollinated by miner bees and long-tongued bees such as bumblebees and orchid bees.
