Skyblue Jacquemontia, **Skyblue Clustervine** Convolvulaceae **Plant Specifics**

Size:	Stems 6-12 ft, tend to sprawl but with support cabe upright, to 12 ft
Life Span:	Long-lived perennial
Flower Color:	Blue
Phenology:	Evergreen. Blooms fall-spring. Flowers usually close by afternoon.
Habitats:	Coastal hammocks esp. on dunes.

Recommended Uses:	Grow as a sprawling vine (will need to be tie a fence or trellis) or used as a groundcover.
Light:	🔅 Full Sun
Moisture Tolerance:	Usually moist, occasional inundation to - Not wet but not extremely dry
Salt Water Flooding Tolerance:	Tolerant of occasional/brief inundation such a can occur in storm surges.
Salt Spray Tolerance:	High. Can tolerate significant and ongoing amounts of salty wind and salt spray without injury.
Soil/Substrate:	Lime rock, Sand
