Attracts a variety of insect pollinators.

Bees documented visiting Opuntia humifusa include Agapostemon splendens, Augochlorella aurata, Augochloropsis sumptuosa, Dialictus nymphalis, D. tegul. Halictus ligatus, Dianthidium floridiense, Lithurgus gibbos Megachile brevis pseudobrevis, M. policaris, M. texana, Melissodes communis, Apis mellifera, Bombus impatiens, pennsylvanicus and Xylocopa virginica krombeini (Deyruş al. 2002).
