## Feay's Palafox

### *Asteraceae (Compositae)*

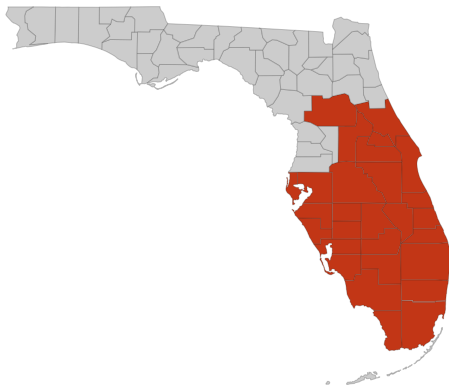
#### Plant Specifics

- Size: 4-5 tall by 2-3 ft wide
- Life Span: Long-lived perennial
- Flower Color: White, pink
- Phenology: Deciduous. Blooms in late July-December.
- Habitats: Scrub and scrubby flatwoods.

#### Landscaping

- Recommended Uses: Since this gets tall, plant it at the rear of a wildflower garden. Blooms in mid-fall with blooms concentrated at the tops of the stem
- Light: ☀ Full Sun
- Moisture Tolerance: Not wet but not extremely dry ----- to ----- Ver long very dry periods
- Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
- Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
- Soil/Substrate: Sand
