Chickasaw Plum

Rosaceae

Plant Specifics

Size: 15-20 ft tall by 15-20 ft wide with new plants growing from rhizomes (underground stems) to form thickets of substantial width

Life Span: Long-lived perennial

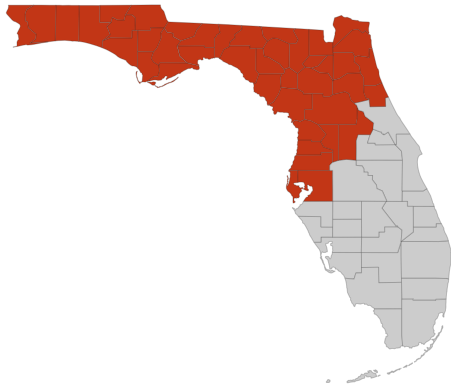
Flower Color: White

Fruit Color: Orange

Phenology: Deciduous

Habitats: Woodland edges, fencerows, open woods. Also cultivated.

Landscaping

Recommended Uses: Plant as a screen where its suckers are welcome (woodland edges, casual but large garden settings)

Light: ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade

Moisture Tolerance: Usually moist, occasional inundation ----- to . Somewhat long very dry periods

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray

Soil/Substrate: Loam, Sand

Wildlife



Birds, squirrels and other animals eat the fruit.

Flowers attract bees. Documented bee visitors include *Dialictus placideizsis*, *Hylaeus conflzeizs*, *Euylae: pectoralis* and *Epeolzcs zonatus* (Deyrup et al. 2002).
