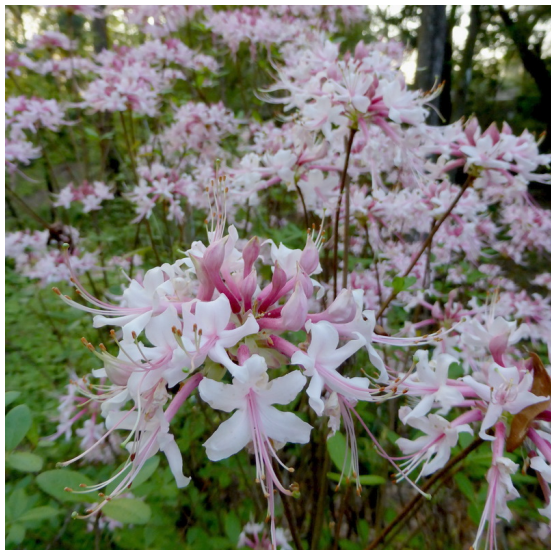

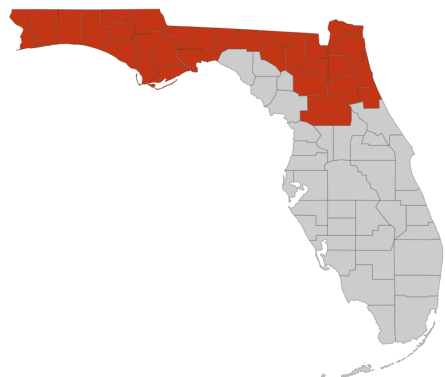
Wild Azalea, Piedmont Azalea, Pinxter Azalea

Plant Specifics

- Size: 10-15 ft tall by 10-15 ft wide
- Life Span: Long-lived perennial
- Flower Color: Pink
- Fruit Color: Brown
- Phenology: Deciduous; blooms in mid-spring. Life span approx. 50 yrs. (Nelson 2003).
- Habitats: Upland hardwood forests, flatwoods, by swamp bluffs, slope forests, secondary woods.

Landscaping

- Recommended Uses: Specimen plant, thicket, or natural background plantings.
- Light: ☀️ Part Shade
- Moisture Tolerance: Usually moist, occasional inundation ----- to Not wet but not extremely dry
- Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
- Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
- Soil/Substrate: Sand
