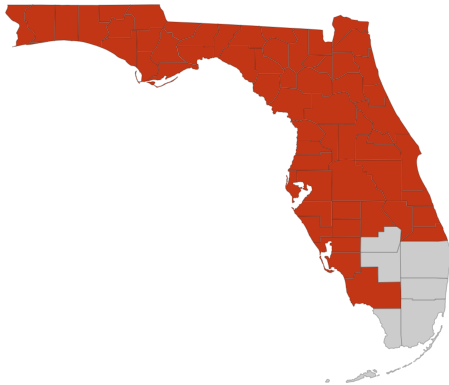

Lyre-leaved Sage *Lamiaceae (Labiatae)*

Plant Specifics

- Size:** 1 - 1.5 ft
- Life Span:** Long-lived perennial
- Flower Color:** Blue, lavender
- Fruit Color:** Brown
- Phenology:** Winter dormant or with only a basal rosette. Blooms in spring.
- Habitats:** Disturbed sites. Roadsides, dry-mesic to mesic areas.

Landscaping

- Recommended Uses:** Wildflower garden. Roadside plantings. Can be mixed in with grasses or other low groundcovers. If kept mowed, it will reward you in the spring by creating a sea of blue.
- Light:** ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade
- Moisture Tolerance:** Usually moist, occasional inundation ----- to - Not wet but not extremely dry
- Salt Water Flooding Tolerance:** Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
- Salt Spray Tolerance:** Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
- Soil/Substrate:** Clay, Loam, Sand
