Plant Specifics

Size: 0.5-0.8 ft tall by 3-5 ft wide

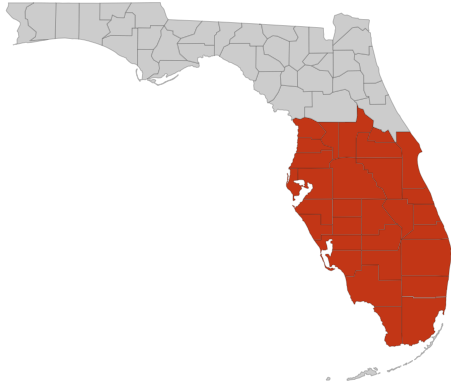
Life Span: Short-lived perennial

Recommended Uses: Used as a ground cover, one of the relatively few Florida plants that both forms a low dense cover and survives shade.

Light: ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade, ☷ Shade

Moisture: Somewhat moist, no flooding ----- to -----

Tolerance: Somewhat long very dry periods

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray

Soil/Substrate: Sand
