## Sassafras Lauraceae Plant Specifics

Size:	30-60 ft tall by 25-40 ft wide, forms clones.
Life Span:	Long-lived perennial
Flower Color:	Yellow,NA
Fruit Color:	Blue,black
Phenology:	Deciduous. Inconspicuous blooms in mid-spring Leaves turn red to yellow in fall.
Habitats:	Dry sites. Dry mesic forests.

## Landscaping

Recommended Uses:	A relatively small tree that often forms thicket Best used in informal settings.
Light:	🏟 Full Sun, 🌤 Part Shade
Moisture Tolerance:	Somewhat moist, no flooding to Ver long very dry periods
Salt Water Flooding Tolerance:	Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
Salt Spray Tolerance:	Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
Soil/Substrate:	Clay, Loam, Sand
