Lamiaceae (Labiatae)

Plant Specifics

- Size: .7 to 1.7 ft tall by .25 to .5 ft wide
- Life Span: Long-lived perennial
- Flower Color: White, pink, purple
- Phenology: Winter dormant
- Habitats: Moist-wet disturbed sites. Flatwoods.

Landscaping

Recommended Uses: In a meadow, where its aggressiveness is an asset. Can be a low maintenance roadside plant. Difficult to recommend for most landscape uses.

Light: ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade, ☁ Shade

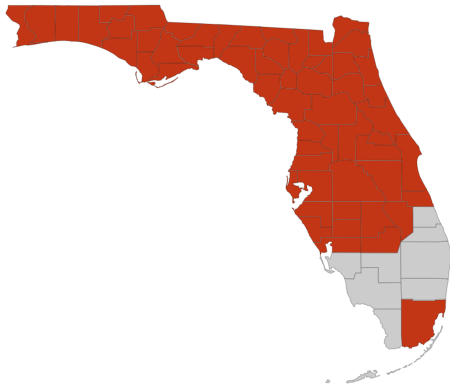
Moisture Tolerance: Usually moist, occasional inundation ----- to Not wet but not extremely dry

Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.

Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray

Soil/Substrate: Loam, Sand
