Poaceae (Gramineae)

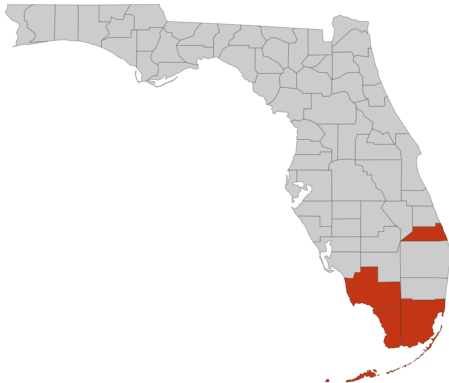
Plant Specifics

- Size: 2-3 ft tall by 2-3 ft wide
- Life Span: Short-lived perennial
- Flower Color: Green
- Phenology: Evergreen. Clump forming.
- Habitats: Pine rockland. Also cultivated. Dry sites.

Landscaping

- Recommended Uses: Informal borders.
- Light: ☀ Full Sun, ☁ Part Shade
- Moisture Tolerance: Somewhat moist, no flooding ----- to ----- Very long very dry periods
- Salt Water Flooding Tolerance: Not salt tolerant of inundation by salty or brackish water.
- Salt Spray Tolerance: Low/no tolerance of salty wind or direct salt spray
- Soil/Substrate: Lime rock, Sand
