#### Wildlife





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The thorny branches make good cover for birds and othe wildlife. Fruits are not generally valued. Attracts pollinators

There are 2 subspecies, *V. farnesiana* var. *farnesiana* and *farnesiana* var. *pinetorum*. Var. *pinetorum* is rare. It is als smaller.

There is a very rare species, *Vachellia macranthera*, occasionally cultivated. It occurs rarely in extreme south Florida and has been found as a likely storm-deposited w a couple of areas on the west coast of FL. If you have it, enjoy it. Culture should be similar to *V. farnesiana*.

Attracts pollinators and uses ants both for protection against unwanted insects.
